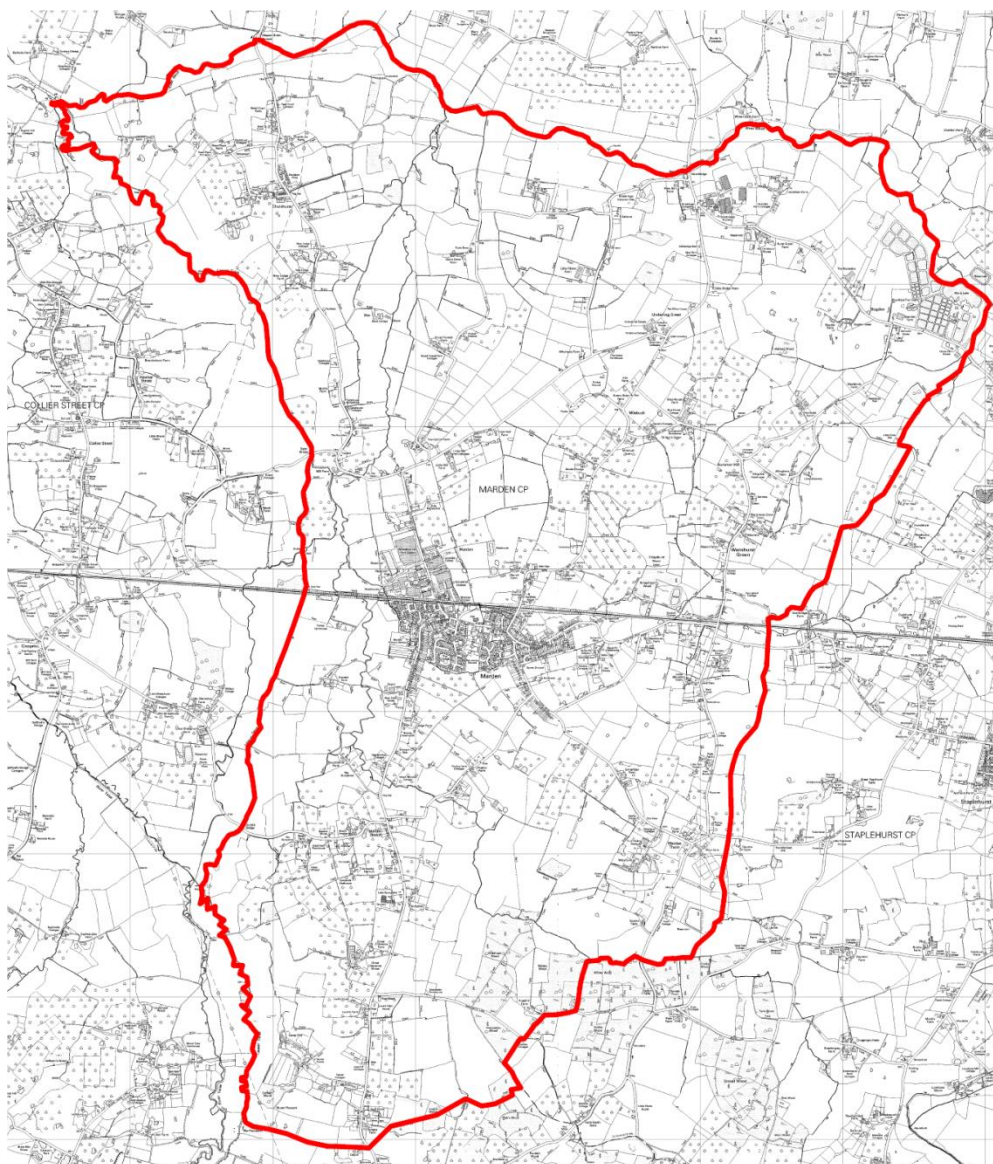
Referendum: Thursday 27 February 2020

Information Statement

A neighbourhood plan referendum will be held for the Marden Neighbourhood Plan 2017 – 2031 on 27 February 2020. The question in the referendum will be:

Do you want Maidstone Borough Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Marden to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?

The referendum area and the area covered by the neighbourhood plan is in the area of Marden (see map below)



A person is entitled to vote in the Referendum if on 27 February 2020

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the Referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the Referendum area. A person qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be registered.

The Referendum expenses limit that will apply in relation to the Referendum is £2568.15.

The number of persons entitled to vote in the Referendum by reference to which the limit has been calculated is 3494.

The Referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
