43. ITEM WITHDRAWN FROM THE AGENDA

The Chairman stated that he had agreed to the withdrawal of this report from the agenda to enable consideration to be given to representations received recently that had not been assessed in the Jacobs report.

- A verbal update on petitions submitted to Kent County Council Highways and Transportation as the item had been inadvertently omitted from the agenda.

 Plans which were inadvertently omitted from the report of the Assistant Director of Environment and Regulatory Services relating to proposed Traffic Regulation Orders.

Councillor Vizzard stated that, as a Ward Member, he was aware of the proposals regarding the implementation of parking restrictions around the entrance to St Francis Catholic Primary School, Queens Road, Maidstone and the introduction of a One Way Traffic Order on a section of Marigold Way, Maidstone.

50. PETITIONS

Mr Peter Griffiths presented a petition calling for road safety measures on Sheals Crescent, Hayle Road and Postley Road, Maidstone, including the installation of signage, a pedestrian crossing, a speed camera and permanent bollards along the central markings on the bend where Upper Stone Street meets Sheals Crescent.

The petition was referred to Kent County Council Highways and Transportation.

51. QUESTIONS/STATEMENTS BY MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC

There were no questions/statements by members of the public.

52. <u>UPDATE ON PETITIONS SUBMITTED TO KENT COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION</u>

The representative of the Head of Transportation reported that, in October 2012, a petition concerning highway safety had been received from residents in Grove Green Lane, Weavering. Consideration had been given to the issues raised, but since Grove Green Lane was a private road, the

Highway Authority could only look at the point where it joined the public highway. No recorded personal injury crashes had been recorded at this location, and the petitioners had been informed that their concerns could not be addressed from a Kent Highways' perspective, and the case had been closed.

RESOLVED: That the report be noted.

53. <u>KENT COUNTY COUNCIL HIGHWAYS AND TRANSPORTATION - WINTER MAINTENANCE</u>

<u>RESOLVED</u>: That Kent County Council Highways and Transportation be thanked for its response to the recent severe winter weather conditions.

54. <u>JOINT TRANSPORTATION BOARDS AGREEMENT AND GOVERNANCE</u>

The Board considered the report of the Future Highways Manager setting out a revised JTB Agreement which, inter alia, provided flexibility for the Chairman to vary the number of Parish Council representatives on the Board. Having first indicated that he would not wish to exercise this delegation without the endorsement of the Board, the Chairman proposed that the number of Parish Council representatives be increased to two, with nominations being made by the Area Committee of the Kent Association of Local Councils.

RESOLVED:

- 1. That the revised draft JTB Agreement and the process for its implementation be noted.
- 2. That the Cabinet Member for Environment, Highways and Waste be recommended to agree that the JTB Agreement be amended to provide for the number of Parish Council representatives to be increased to two, with nominations being made by the Area Committee of the Kent Association of Local Councils.

55. QUEENS ROAD, MAIDSTONE - PARKING RESTRICTIONS

The Board considered the report of the Head of Transportation setting out the response to the advertisement of the proposed implementation of parking restrictions around the entrance to St Francis Catholic Primary School, Queens Road, Maidstone. It was noted that the majority of the respondents objected to the proposals on the grounds that the removal of parking would increase the speed of through traffic. Parking in close proximity to the school entrance did result in the obstruction of visibility for traffic leaving the school site, and the installation of the corner protection element of the proposals would mitigate this.

<u>RESOLVED</u>: That having considered the response to the advertisement of the proposed implementation of parking restrictions around the entrance to St Francis Catholic Primary School, Queens Road, Maidstone, the Cabinet Member for Environment, Highways and Waste be recommended to approve the installation of corner protection only.

56. MARIGOLD WAY - ONE WAY TRAFFIC ORDER

The Board considered the report of the Head of Transportation setting out the response to the advertisement of the proposed One Way Traffic Order on a section of Marigold Way, Maidstone. It was noted that:-

- No formal objections had been received from members of the public. However, Kent Police had objected strongly to the proposal on the grounds that the length of the restriction was so short that it was likely to be ignored and regularly abused by drivers to the detriment of road safety. The Police had asked that the Order be made self enforcing so as to reduce the level of enforcement needed on site by their Officers.
- Kent County Council Highways and Transportation could install advance signage to ensure that the restriction was conspicuous from the road. However, it was the recommendation of the Officers that the Order should not be implemented.

The Board supported the implementation of the scheme and considered that the installation of the additional signage and road markings would reinforce the restriction. In addition, it was suggested that representatives of the Police should be invited to attend a future meeting of the Board to explain their approach to traffic regulation enforcement.

RESOLVED:

- 1. That the Cabinet Member for Environment, Highways and Waste be recommended to approve the implementation of the proposed One Way Traffic Order on a section of Marigold Way.
- 2. That representatives of the Police be invited to attend a future meeting of the Board to discuss their approach to traffic regulation enforcement.

57. OBJECTIONS TO TRAFFIC ORDERS

The Board considered the report of the Assistant Director of Environment and Regulatory Services setting out the response to the formal public consultation relating to various Traffic Regulation Orders.

58. INTEGRATED TRANSPORT STRATEGY UPDATE

The Board considered the joint report of the Head of Transportation and the Director of Change, Planning and the Environment setting out details of the progress to date in relation to the redrafting of the Integrated Transport Strategy and of the implications of the Borough Council's decision to reschedule its Core Strategy programme.

During the discussion on the report, Members made reference to the following:-

- The need for Officers to respond to the concerns expressed by Members at the last meeting of the Board, particularly in relation to the bus lane and the proposed scheme of mitigation for current and forecast congestion at the A26/B2246 Fountain Lane junction.
- The likely timescale for the presentation of the revised Strategy, particularly taking into account the strength of feeling locally against the proposal to construct a one-way gyratory system in Barming, and the implications for the residents of St Andrews Road and Fountain Lane whose properties are affected.
- The arrangements for funding the infrastructure required to support housing and employment growth and other necessary infrastructure improvements. It was suggested that funds should be set aside by the Borough Council from its New Homes Bonus and that a case be made to the County Council for funding to implement schemes to relieve congestion and improve road safety in the Borough.
- The Informal Member Group comprising representatives of the Borough and County Councils and the Joint Transportation Board should continue to meet on a regular basis to support the Officers in the redrafting of the Strategy and it was hoped that the outcome would be a document that had the general agreement by Members.
- The Core Strategy and the Integrated Transport Strategy were interlinked because of the need for transport infrastructure to support strategic site allocations. Any substantive changes to the Borough Council's housing and employment targets and the strategic site allocations originally proposed would need to be addressed in the revised Integrated Transport Strategy.

RESOLVED:

- 1. That the report be noted.
- 2. That the Borough and County Councils be recommended to agree that the composition of the Informal Member Group set up to support the Officers in the redrafting of the Integrated Transport Strategy be as follows:-

Summary: The purpose of this report is to provide members with a progress report on petitions currently being considered by KCC Highways and Transportation

1. Petitions currently under consideration

A274 Sutton Valence Speed Limit Reduction

2. Work undertaken

A petition was submitted in September 2012 by Sutton Valence Parish Council with over 250 signatures, requesting an extension of the 30 mph speed limit on the A274 Northwards to Five Wents junction.

Following speed surveys which indicated that the existing mean speeds of 34.1mph Northbound and 35.1Southbound (85%ile 38.9mph and 39.8 mph respectively); Kent police were formally consulted. They stated that they would not support the reduction, based on the then current guidance of Circular1/2006 and the existing vehicle speeds. The current 40mph was largely complied with and if it were reduced to 30mph would likely require constant enforcement.

Given the likely objection to the proposal from Kent Police should the proposal proceed and the likely ineffectiveness of the speed limit changes to reduce speeds, Kent County Council would not currently proceed with the request at this time. Sutton Valence Parish Council was informed of this decision.

3. New petitions

A229 Sheals Crescent

A petition was submitted to the January Joint Transportation Board requesting road safety measures in the Postley Road and Sheals Crescent area of Maidstone. The petition was submitted following a recent fatal crash and contained over 600 signatures.

Kent County Council have analysed the recent personal injury crash history for Sheals Crescent and Hayle Road has and there is no record of crashes involving pedestrians or excessive speeds except the recent tragic crash which had extenuating circumstances and no reasonable road safety measures could have prevented. It would therefore be difficult, given the current circumstances, to justify major expenditure in this area. Kent Police have not indicated they consider there were any highway infrastructure concerns relating to the recent tragic event.

The County Council will continue to monitor the situation in the area and should either Kent Police or the Coroner raise any concerns about the highway as a result of this recent tragic incident, the County will take their recommendations very seriously. The lead petitioner has been written to by the Cabinet Member for Highways and Waste and informed of this decision.

Summary: This report updates Members on progress with the Draft Joint Integrated Transport Strategy since the previous meeting of the Board in January.

1. Background

1.1 At the last meeting of the Joint Transportation Board (JTB) on 23rd January, Members endorsed the establishment of an Informal Member Group (IMG) on the Integrated Transport Strategy (ITS). The Board was also informed of a delay to the programme for the Core Strategy and the ITS to enable the evidence underpinning the Borough Council's housing and employment targets to be reviewed.

2. Core Strategy housing target

- 2.1 At the most recent meeting of the IMG, County Council Members raised serious concerns regarding the deliverability of the Core Strategy, citing the level of forecast journey time increase on arterial routes and the limited funding available for compensatory transport infrastructure.
- 2.2 These concerns have been compounded by the decision of Maidstone Borough Council (MBC)'s Cabinet last month to approve an increased working target of 14,800 dwellings for the Maidstone Borough Local Plan period 2011 to 2031. This target will remain in place until the ongoing review of the borough's housing land supply and the identification of environmental constraints to development is completed later this year.

3. Next steps

3.1 In view of these concerns, a meeting has been arranged between senior officers of both authorities later this month to discuss the revised housing target and its implications for the ITS. The outcome of this meeting will be reported to the IMG, which will be asked to guide the

further transport modelling work that is likely to be required to assess the impact of the agreed housing target and to identify potential mitigation measures.

3.2 The IMG has also requested that further technical work be commissioned to assess options for improving the operation of the Bridge Gyratory and that officers meet with colleagues at Essex County Council to discuss the factors influencing the success of Chelmsford's Park and Ride service and their applicability to Maidstone. The outcome of both of these work streams will be reported to the IMG and to this Board in due course.

A Common Sense Plan for Safe and Sensible Street

Lighting

Classification:

For Decision

Summary: This provides details of the County Council's plan for safe and sensible street lighting and requests Members' views on the proposals.

Introduction

- 1. There are around 120,000 street lights and 30,000 lit signs/bollards in Kent. The annual energy cost for these is around £5.8m, a cost which is expected to rise in line with the rise in fossil fuel prices.
- 2. There isn't a legal requirement for the County Council to provide street lighting except when linked to road safety. However it has become established practice over time and almost all street lights in Kent are continually lit during the hours of darkness. There is a fitted light sensor in each column which automatically turns the lights on at dusk and turns them off at first light.
- 3. The Government's Carbon Reduction Commitment requires councils to publish their greenhouse gas emissions, including CO2. To generate the energy to illuminate the street lights in Kent produces 29,000 tonnes of CO2. Although it has not been a requirement to pay for carbon credits, this is likely to change and some form of levy linked to carbon emission is likely to be introduced thus increasing the cost of energy even further.
- 4. The aim is to target wasted energy whilst ensuring that we maintain community and road safety. We have been working with Kent Police to make sure that these issues are considered very carefully and that vulnerable sites are excluded from the proposals.
- 5. The challenge of rising energy costs, carbon emissions and light pollution were among the key factors in developing a new approach. This led to the approval of the policy of reducing energy consumption.

What we have done so far

6. A number of initiatives have been completed that reduced energy consumption delivering an annual saving of £130k. These are;

- Upgrades 6,500 inefficient mercury lamps as well as 3,441 failing lamps have been replaced with energy efficient units.
- Trimming The photocell in 13,000 lamps has been reset to reduce burning time (lights come on later at dusk and going off earlier at dawn). All new columns have these photocells as standard.
- Dimming New lanterns have been fitted to 500 columns to dim the wattage at pre-determined times to reduce energy consumption.

What we plan to do

- 7. It was always acknowledged that significant work would need to be done to meet the challenge of escalating cost of energy, carbon emissions and intense light pollution.
- 8. Further work on this front led to the identification of measures to significantly reduce energy consumption. These are proposed to be delivered in two phases; Trial Switch Off of Surplus Lights (Phase 1) and conversion of a significant number of lights to Part Night Lighting (Phase 2). These measures, when fully implemented, will reduce the annual energy bill and carbon emission significantly, by around £900,000 and 5,000 tonnes respectively.

Phase 1 -Trial Switch off of Surplus Lights

- 9. In the past, the extent of street lighting went far beyond the required needs; around 3,100 street lights have been identified where lighting is considered not necessary. If these schemes were being designed today these lights would not be installed. These are far in excess of the normal lighting standards and have a disproportionate maintenance cost due to their locations. These are generally located on roads leading to or out of local settlements.
- 10. We propose to switch these lights off for a trial period of 12 months. Site specific risk assessments and a safety audit for each road has been carried out to make sure that we only switch off lights that are not needed. Crime levels and road safety will be monitored at each site throughout the trial period and lighting columns on sites being adversely affected will be switched back on. Lighting columns on unaffected sites will be reviewed at the end of the trial period to determine whether action needs to be taken. Lights within settlements will be retained.
- 11. Switching off these lights will save the tax payer around £150,000 and reduce our carbon emission by about 1,000 tonnes every year.
- 12. A list of these lights and a plan of each site within the Maidstone Borough are shown in Appendices A and B respectively. The works will be undertaken on a District by District basis and, is due to commence in early summer 2013. The programme of switching off surplus columns will take

approximately 2 months to complete. The specific dates for the trial switch off in Maidstone Borough will be notified to Members nearer the time. Signs informing of the trial switch off will be erected at each site.

Phase 2 - Part-night lighting

- 13. This proposal involves installing a light sensor in each column which has a built in timer. This means that the column would turn on automatically at dusk, turn off at 12.00 midnight, turn back on at a 05.30a.m and stay on until first light. Apart from switching off and removing the columns, this is the most effective way of saving energy, very much like a householder turning off lights at night when going to bed.
- 14. This would apply to two categories of roads; minor roads (which include residential, industrial estates and rural roads) and high speed roads. There are around 70,000 street lights in these roads which could be changed to part-night lighting and could result in a reduction of up to 15% in the annual energy bill, around £750,000, and reduce carbon emission by around 4,000 tonnes every year
- 15. Here too, community safety will be paramount, before any street lights are changed to part-night, risk assessments will be carried out to make sure that it will not have an adverse impact on the locality.
- 16. Some may consider that implementing part-night lighting might lead to increases in road accidents, antisocial behaviour and an increased fear of crime. The implementation of part night lighting by other Local Authorities however has shown that this is not the case as sites where streetlights have been dimmed or switched off traffic accidents and crime have not increased. This fear is based on perception rather than actual data. As with the trial switch off proposals, (Phase 1), Kent County Council's aim is to target the wasted energy whilst ensuring we maintain safety and help reduce crime.
- 17. The programme for conversion to part night lighting is at a much earlier stage as we need to consult with interested parties, including residents and the police, about the hours of switch off and whether any further criteria needs to be considered.

Exclusion Criteria

- 18. The approach proposed in Kent is similar to other local authorities. Locations for this energy saving initiative will be considered suitable for inclusion unless they meet one or more of the exclusion criteria listed below
 - Main routes and locations with a significant night-time traffic record between 12.00 midnight and 05.30am.
 - Town centres.

- Areas identified by the Police as having an existing record of crime or having the potential for increased crime levels if the street lighting is changed.
- Areas with sheltered housing and other residences accommodating vulnerable people.
- Areas with operational emergency services site including hospitals and nursing homes.
- Formal pedestrian crossings, subways and enclosed footpaths and alleyways where one end links to a road that is lit all night.
- Where road safety measures are on place in the highway, such as roundabouts, central carriageways islands, chicanes, speed humps, etc.
- Roads that have local authority CCTV or Police surveillance equipment.
- Sites with existing or with potential road safety concerns.

Recommendations

- Members are asked to consider each site selected for the trial switch off of surplus lights and suggest any local information that may help officers to determine how to proceed with each location.
- II. Members' are asked to consider the exclusion criteria used for the Partnight Lighting initiative and suggest any changes.
- III. Members' views are sought on the hours of switch off for Part-night Lighting.





Summary: The purpose of this report is to update Members on the changes on a recommendation made by the board.

Background:

- 1. A report was previously brought before the Board regarding a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) and associated protection for Clapper Farm Lane.
- 2. The board previously recommended proceeding with the advertising of the TRO along with the Kent Carriage Gap for protection for the lane.
- 3. The order was advertised and an objection was received along with a number of comments. Following recent issues in the lane and a further discussion with the British Driving Society it was agreed due to the limited usage by carriages on the lane and the limited protection the Kent Carriage Gap would offer, they would support the Equestrian gates with pedestrian side gates.
- 4. An update was sent to the residents / County Members and interested parties including the British Driving Society, informing them of the change of position with regards to the Kent Carriage Gap.
- 5. The British Driving Society subsequently withdrew their support following the update.
- 6. The purpose of the order / protection is to stop motor vehicles from driving through this section of green lane protecting the interests of the users and residents and the surface of the lane.

Current Position

- 7. The objection and comments to the TRO have been considered by the Director of H&T along with the change in protection for the lane. After discussions with the two local County Members and the Chairman of the Joint Transportation Board, it has been agreed to install the equestrian gates along with radar key pedestrian side gates.
- 8. The gates will provide the protection from motor vehicles for the lane. Unfortunately they will give a closed off look but the purpose is to stop motor vehicles, whilst allowing legitimate usage. The Kent Carriage Gap will not offer any deterrent to motorcycles / quad bikes and in the ground conditions could be liable to damage / removal, as only 300mm high. In addition Kent Police requires such orders to be self-enforcing and have made representation to this as part of the TRO process.
- 9. It is understood this is not what everyone would like to see and clearly whatever is proposed is not going to satisfy all, but with the gates it will still allow access to walkers, wheelchair users, horses,

carriages and the like. On balance the impact on those with protected characteristics is limited and no greater than issues created by unlawful vehicular use, criminal activity and damage to the surface of the route.

Summary: This report provides an update on the Leeds and Langley trial as well as other schemes proposed in Maidstone.

1 Background

- **1.1** Lorry Watch is a joint initiative between Kent County Council, Kent Police, The Kent Association of Local Councils and Parish Councils/local residents.
- 1.2 Lorry Watch aims to support and empower local residents in areas where issues with the through traffic of Heavy Goods Vehicles (HGVs) persist. Residents are provided with temporary signs to publicise the scheme and warn HGV drivers that it is underway. Local volunteers record the identifying features of large vehicles on unsuitable roads and these are passed onto Kent Police. Kent Police then contact the vehicle operators to enquire as to their purpose in the area.
- 1.3 It is important to note that the UK's economy relies on road haulage and in instances where it emerges that vehicles had a valid reason to be in an area e.g. local collections or deliveries this will be fed back to residents. Kent County Council appreciates the vibrancy of Kent's rural economy and in no way wants to penalise businesses that need to receive or dispatch HGVs. Lorry Watch aims to create an environment whereby the lines of communication between local residents and local businesses are open for all parties' mutual benefit.

2 Leeds and Langley Pilot

- 2.1 This pilot scheme was launched on the 14/11/12. This scheme focuses on the B2163 Leeds Rd which, although subject to a 17 tonne vehicle weight restriction, is often used as a cut through between the A20 and the A274. Temporary signs, provided by KCC, were erected by the Parish Councils on the 11/11/12 and the permanent width limit signs have been substantially upgraded.
- 2.2 The scheme ran until January 2013 with regular watches being carried out by Leeds' residents. The decision has now been made by the volunteers to run Lorry Watch once per quarter to try and avoid volunteer fatigue and ensure that the scheme does not lose momentum. The residents have been provided

with larger temporary signs as a result of learning from the previous launch and these will be erected alongside a fortnightly observation regime in April.

- 2.3 There has been an issue around recruiting and retaining volunteers and the scheme is now administered by a small committed group of Leeds residents. In the run up to the scheme launch Langley Parish Council were very supportive and assisted a great deal however they have been unable to mobilise any volunteers. They have made it clear that unless volunteers come forward for April's re-start then they will withdraw due to a lack of community interest.
- 2.4 The data collected shows that only four companies were observed within the restriction on more than one occasion. Kent Police have contacted these companies and in all cases are now chasing up the companies concerned having failed to receive a suitable response. A number of other successes were also recorded including a local company purchasing smaller vehicles that can navigate the restriction legally.

3 Other areas

- 3.1 Ulcombe Parish Council Will not be carrying out formal observations but have been provided with temporary signage and will pass on the details of any vehicles observed in Chegworth Rd.
- 3.2 Teston Parish Council Are aiming to launch a formal scheme in April concentrating on Teston Bridge. This will be associated with the successful Speed Watch already operating in the area and will be supported by permanent signage improvement in the area.

Summary: The Chairman of the JTB has requested this item is reported on until completion of the ongoing Gas Main replacement works within Maidstone.

Morrison Utilities, working on behalf of Southern Gas Networks, have completed the works on Upper Stone Street and moved onto Hayle Road. This is the final phase of these works. This phase will be completed in two sections, the junction with Campbell Road being the location when the first section finishes and the second will start. This changeover will take place in the next fourteen days. The right hand lane will be closed, initially between College walk and Campbell Road, and then between Campbell Road and Sheal's Crescent/ Postley Road. The Highway Management Centre and the Roadworks Team are closely monitoring traffic flow and adjusting traffic light timings to keep traffic disruption to a minimum.

The project is progressing well, and when the second phase is started there will be additional coning in place at the junction of Sheal's Crescent, Upper Stone Street and Loose Road. The design of this will be the same as when the road was used as a diversion for Knightrider Street, which aided the movement of traffic and reduced congestion on Upper Stone Street.

This will finish the town centre project and is due to conclude on the 26th April.

In conclusion, the Roadworks Co-ordination Team continue to work closely with Maidstone Borough Council and Morrison Utilities to ensure this complicated and high profile project is completed on time and causes the least amount of disruption, and that the reinstatements are completed to the highest quality.
